Are you any good at making pancakes? If you're anything like me, the first one doesn't always work too well, but once you've got the

hang of it, they're not too bad. I wonder though, do you ever attempt to flip them?

I recently read something that made me laugh. It said: flipping pancakes is like life: sometimes it's messy, sometimes it's a little crispy around the edges, but when it works, it's flipping awesome. And you know what, I think there's a lot of truth in that.

I have two wonderful daughters, and if they 'help' me to make pancakes, you can guarantee there will be a big mess to clear up afterwards. Unless I want to spend longer cleaning up than I do actually making pancakes, then I must admit I tend to do it myself.

But what an observation. Sometimes life is messy. It's a fact. However much we might think we have our lives together, there are times when we can't see past the chaos. There are times we might worry what others think of us and our less than picture perfect lives, there are times we wonder how we will get things back to how we want them to be. Sometimes life is messy. And that's okay.

Sometimes when I make pancakes, if I put too much oil in the frying pan, or leave it a little too long, it will be crispy around the edges. Depending on how crispy they are, impacts whether they will be happily eaten by my children, or the dogs. It's another thing that makes them less than perfect, not as we want them to be. That's okay too.

Lent, starting after Pancake Day, is a time when we're getting ready for Easter. It's a time when we prepare our hearts for the joy of what Easter will bring with its new possibilities. Easter, after all, is Jesus right there with us in our mess. Jesus with us when things are a little less than perfect around the edges. But what a hope we can find, when we

realise that despite all our imperfections, we can all find a new hope in Jesus. Hope for a new start now, in relationship with our creator God; and a hope for a future life beyond death. That really is flipping awesome!


I've never really been someone who does very much for Lent, as in all honesty, I never really saw the point of it. I have never quite worked out how me giving up something I enjoy does anything other than make me a little more grumpy at some point in the day, especially if it's coffee I've chosen to resist.

So instead, I try to think of something that I can do differently instead, something I can 'flip' as it were. Something that will have a positive impact on the world around me, even in a small way.

It might be something as simple as doing something kind for someone else. It could be chatting to someone who looks like they could do with a chat. Small things that can help turn a bad day into a better one. As you flip your pancakes, don't worry if you make a mess in the

process or they turn out less than perfect. The great news is that it will soon be Easter, and what an awesome joy that's going to bring with it.

Dormansland Parish Council



We are pleased to announce that our new Parish Clerk, Steven Rees, joined us on the 10th February 2025. We are confident that he will make a strong and positive contribution to the Parish.

You will notice that the roof of the bus shelter, opposite St John's Church, has been completely renovated. We hope you agree it looks very smart. The Parish receives money from larger building projects to pay for Parish Infrastructure. This money is known as the Community Infrastructure Levy, so we have used this levy to pay for the roof. We asked Tandridge Council to remove the graffiti from the walls of the shelter and they have done this for us. We have published how we have used the levy in previous years, in the news section of the parish website.

We are actively planning for the Annual Parish Assembly. The proposed date is Thursday the 24th April 2025. The Parish Council and the trustees of The Dormansland War Memorial Hall are joining forces for the Annual Assembly and the official opening of the Hall. We will tell you more about it in next month's Village Voice and there will be posters on the notice board. As this is the resident's opportunity to discuss matters with the Councillors, we welcome your input into the programme.

Unfortunately, there will be a delay to the refurbishment to the playground and it is not likely to start until September 2025. The group working on the playground had a very encouraging response to their initial enquiry from the Lottery Fund, but when they made their application, they were advised it had not been successful. The group are now considering raising a Go Fund Me appeal and are seeking donations from local businesses. Any support you are able to give would be welcomed. Tandridge District Council are providing a considerable grant but the working group want to commission the best possible and most accessible playground for all the children who may use it.

In wider news, the Parish Council is following the progress of the application for a second runway at Gatwick and the decision to divide

the administrative structure of Surrey into smaller Unitary Authorities. Both these plans will have an impact on Dormansland and we will make sure that our voice is heard in any consultations.



On our recent amazing trip to Oz and Tasmania, in Albany, Western Australia we came across the church of St John the Evangelist.

Unfortunately the church was closed but the two volunteers in the Parish Office gave us a leaflet with the interesting history of the church. They apologised that they could not show us around but since COVID they had a much



depleted team and were extremely busy. How familiar does that sound? A few doing the many jobs.

I was disappointed until on leaving I saw the line of people waiting for them to open the food bank and give other help with services offered there. This was far more important than showing two OAPs around the building!

Later on our holiday we travelled on the now preserved Wilderness West Coast Railway in Tasmania.

We were told that the Victorian workers had to carve their way through miles of thick rainforest largely by hand moving thousands of cubic



metres of soil and rock in a harsh climate and awful harsh conditions. The railway had been the only way to get the copper from the mine at Queenstown to the markets.

Our young enthusiastic guide pointed out interesting features on the way including the many types of plants and trees and emphasised the attitude of all those involved at the time to complete this railway. "If it can't happen, make it" she

reiterated several times as their motto.

This positive attitude is one I favour. It's sometimes too easy to be defeated and give up when faced by life's challenges.

The two volunteers at St John's Albany were struggling with the enormity of the task of giving help and aid to those in need, but with determination they were making a much needed difference in the local community .

Wouldn't it be a positive move for our St John's and our village if we tried to adopt this attitude this spring? I'm sure the results would astound us .I challenge you to try. When something seems impossible let's remember, "If it can't happenmake it!"

FANCY PLAYING FOR THE VILLAGE'S CRICKET CLUB THIS YEAR?


Join Dormansland Cricket Club in 2025 and you can expect a really warm welcome.




