From Rev. Ian. Vicar of Lingfield & Dormansland

It has really struck me recently how we seem to struggle with hope at the moment. Whether it be in conversations I have with people, or what I read on social media, or hear on the news. There seems to be little hope that we can find a way forward to a better future locally, nationally or globally.

Yes, I am convinced, not just because of my faith, that we should have hope. I see it in the faces on the children and young people I engage with Youth Hub on a Wednesday, when I am in the local schools or when I am carrying out my chaplaincy role at Young Epilepsy. And because of this we need to have hope for them because if we decide not, and it is a decision we can make, if we decide not to have hope then we start to crush the hope the next generation have. I see so often, especially on Social media, when we demonise out Young People instead of finding ways to support and uplift them, to show them love instead of criticism.

Our great mistake is that we tie hope to outcome.

If we can see a likely path to our desired outcome, we have hope; if we can see no possible path to our desired outcome, we have despair. If we are unsure whether there is a possible path or not, we keep hope alive, but it remains vulnerable to defeat if that path is closed.

When our prime motive is love, a different logic comes into play. We find courage and confidence, not in the likelihood of a good outcome, but in our commitment to love. Love may or may not provide a way through to a solution to our predicament, but it will provide a way forward in our predicament, one step into the unknown at a time. Sustained by this fierce love we may persevere long enough that, to our surprise, a new way may appear where there had been no way.

At that point, we will have reasons for hope again. But even if hope

never returns, we will live by love through our final breath.

To put it differently, even if we lose hope for a good outcome, we need not lose hope of being good people, as we are able: courageous, wise, kind, loving, "in defiance of all that is bad around us."

We feel arising within us this sustained declaration: We will live as beautifully, bravely, and kindly as we can as long as we can, no matter how ugly, scary, and mean the world becomes, even if failure and death seem inevitable. In fact, it is only in the context of failure and death that this virtue develops. This kind of hope is "the fruit of a learned capacity to suffer wisely and generously. You come out much larger and that largeness becomes your hope."

Hope is complicated. But ... even if hope fails, something bigger can replace it, and that is love.

It is a decision for each of us to make, we can get up each morning and decide to have hope, decide to show love to those around us.

Warning Road Closures

Gas network upgrades in the Dormans Road area are going to cause road closures and traffic disruption in Dormansland. The works are estimated to start on the 30th September.

The project is going to last approximately 10 weeks and will impact anyone living in or driving through Dormansland

- West Street (bottom end) from 7 October until estimated 6 December.
- Hollow Lane from 4 November to estimated 6 December
- Dormans Road 11 November till 6 December

Steve Pond (check out his Above East Grinstead Facebook page) will be giving a talk at midday, find out about bat monitors and play around with a light meters with Samantha and Lucy, there will be the Three Fishes keeping us in warm clothing, facepainting by Sophie and Sarah, the Edenbridge Astronomers will be guiding us to a field to look at the stars and Natalie Williamson will hold an awakening the moon yoga ceremony (book direct with Natalie). We are delighted that Sue and Tim from Green Bean catering in Lingfield will be serving us soup and rolls as well as cake and Acana bars will be keeping us watered. The Parish Council will be around on the day helping to meet and greet and marshal the event. We hope to see many residents attend.

In other exciting news Jac, our Baptist Minister, Sian a resident, Lesley Steeds our County Councillor and our own Hilary Taylor have been exploring a refurbishment of the playground. The purpose of this is to make the playground more accessible, inclusive and to cater for all ages up to 18, we are hopeful to see designs in the coming month. In other news the **DPC received a consultation from TDC on the future of the public toilets in the park.** Unfortunately, this was received after the PC meeting and has to be returned before the next one and we are therefore unable to collect residents views on the subject. In summary, the DPC believe that the toilets are a necessity and would not want them closed, and nor do we see how the practicality of 'paying for a visit'

would work. Our response will therefore be robust. However, if you have an alternative view please do let us know.

If you were impacted by the **recent flooding** we would urge you to contact Surrey to register the area as this may help focus on drain clearance etc.

Finally, the positively tropical conditions of wet, followed by sun, followed by rain have encourage foliage growth. We have been asked by Surrey to mention that if you have land that borders pavements and paths and the foliage is become over grown could you strim and trim!

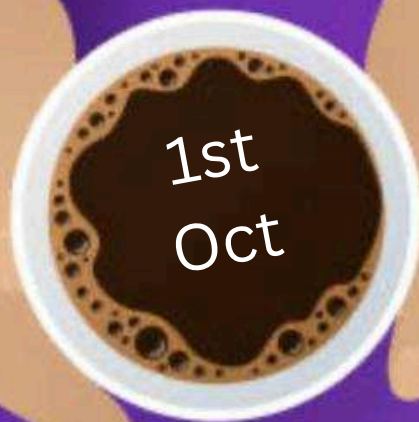

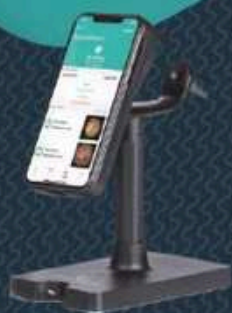

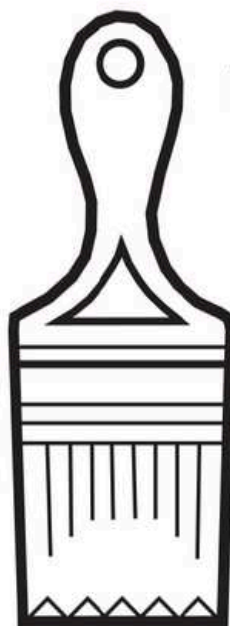

Occasionally this is a social evening, as in August, when Shuffleboard, which has been around since the fifteenth century, came to Dormansland and proved to be tremendous fun. The theme of our October meeting will be “The Story Behind the Bags & Hats from Madagascar” and no doubt there will be a chance for some retail therapy.

Secondly, we organise a variety of outings, including an annual pilgrimage to Hever Two Sisters Theatre where we picnic in the grounds before the show. This year our choice was “Motown and More” an outstanding performance which had the audience dancing on the lawns. This summer we have visited Lullingstone World Garden, the Hannah Peschar sculpture garden, a Butterfly Farm in Ditchling, and the KSS Air Ambulance base at Redhill Aerodrome. We are looking forward to a skittles night at Limpsfield soon, and the popular pantomime at Chequer Mead Theatre in December.

Thirdly, there is a more serious side to WI which is campaigning on issues of national and international importance. WI is currently monitoring river water quality around the country, and we will be playing our part by taking samples from our local rivers, for analysis.

Fourthly, every WI member has access to free on-line learning at www.learninghub.thewi.org.uk offering both live and recorded tutorials on subjects such as digital studies, business training, wellbeing, exercise, arts and crafts, social history, and much more. This resource is also available to any non-member at a small charge.

Fifthly (?) Dormans Evening offers friendship throughout the month, We play Mah-Jong and Rummikub, have two book clubs, the day-time Book Worms, and the evening Glow Worms. Our Walkie-Talkie group offers weekly walks. Our craft group has produced hundreds of blankets and

hats for the premature baby units at East Surrey and Royal Surrey Hospitals. Our Coffee Mates social club meets at Chequer Mead Apron Cafe once a month, and our Film & Theatre Club offers opportunities for members to visit local theatres together.

Finally, warm congratulations go to our sister WI, YWI Dormansland, for winning a number of prizes at the craft event held by Surrey Federation of WIs at the Edenbridge & Oxted Show in the Horticulture Marquee. What a tremendous achievement.

We welcome visitors, so please join us in The Parish Room on the second Thursday of the month at 7:30 pm to get a taste of WI and to see what it has to offer. There is no charge to visitors.

If you live locally, are aged 65 and above, feel apprehensive and wary about IT and the internet, left out by the pace of change as the world becomes increasingly digital, or simply feel that you need to acquire some basic IT skills, the College of St. Barnabas may be able to help.

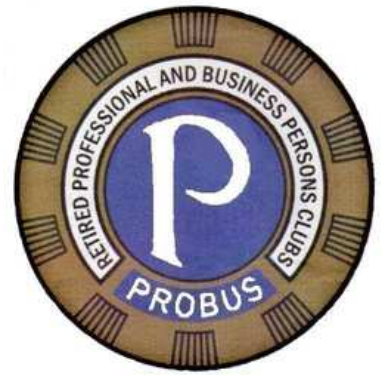

If anyone witnessed a group of ladies digging around in the undergrowth around Dormansland one evening in August, that would have been YWI Dormansland on a foraging expedition. Under the guidance of an expert forager James Grant, we learnt all about the cooking ingredients and medicine cabinet that line our footpaths and woodlands, including:



- edible berries and leaves for eating raw, or cooking into jams and jellies, pickles, drinks, cordials, ketchups, and so much more
- edible flowers that can be used to add to salads, make syrups, or just look beautiful decorating dishes
- leaves that can be used as an insect repellent, to treat nettle stings, draw out thorns and stings, or as a nicotine-free alternative to tobacco
- an array of 'herbs and spices' with flavours including clove, sumac, citrus, coriander, pineapple, honey, and umami
- and not forgetting some horse chestnuts for a quick game of conkers – subject to Health & Safety guidelines of course!



For our September meeting, we were finally back indoors, with a presentation about the Women's Land Army. And what a fascinating education it was. Maybe like me you think of the Women's Land Army as being a product of WWII, when it turns that it was initially formed during WWI to help address the challenges of feeding the country. It was then revived during WWII and grew to a much greater prominence. In total 88 thousand women were involved within the Land Army, working 360 days a year to keep the country supplied with the necessary wheat, additional crops, and timber. And all of this under the

awesome supervision of Lady Denman who, as the first President of the WI, made the amazing achievements feel that little bit more special for all of us current WI members.

On **Tuesday 8th October** we will welcome comedy writer Colin Bostock-Smith who tells yarns of his 35 years in the business writing for the likes of Bob Monkhouse, David Jason, Rowan Atkinson, Anne Robinson (not the ed.), Russ Abbott, The Two Ronnies, Griff Rhys Jones, Pamela Stephenson and, not to be overlooked, Basil Brush.
